

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILSON, NORTH CAROLINA FIXING A DATE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE QUESTION OF AN ANNEXATION BY PETITION FILED PURSUANT TO N.C.G.S. 160A-31

WHEREAS, the owners of certain real property non-contiguous to the City of Wilson, North Carolina, have signed and filed with the City Clerk a petition for annexation of the tract of land more particularly described therein. A copy of said petition is on file at the Land Development office and is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has investigated the sufficiency of the petition pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 16OA-31 and has certified that the same is in all respects correct and sufficient;

Subject: Demolition/Repair - 504 Mercer Street, South West

<u>Issue:</u> Building is hazardous to the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City due to violations of Chapter 43 of the City Code regarding minimum maintenance standards for Residential Structures. The structure is structurally unstable, open to the public and constitutes a safety hazard.

<u>Background / Summary:</u> Hearing offered with owner not in attendance, and Facts of Finding submitted to owner. Owner is not able/willing to repair the building. This building is dilapidated and needs to be repaired/demolished.

<u>Fiscal or Other Impact:</u> May cause other surrounding properties to potentially depreciate in value.

Recommendation: Staff recommends repair/demolition ordinance.



SECTION 1. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to place a sign containing this legend:

"This dwelling is unfit for human habitation; the use or occupancy of this dwelling for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful."

on the dwelling located at the following address: 504 Mercer St. SW, Wilson, NC; PIN# 3721 19 4520; owned by HEIRS OF BETTY M. BROWN C/O WADE TROUTMAN, JR. and ELISHA M. BLACKSTONE MANAGING MEMBER BLACKSTONE ENTERPRISES, LLC.

SECTION 2. The Building Inspector is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to demolish the above-described dwelling in accordance with his order to the owner thereof dated the 2nd day of August and the Housing Code and G.S. 160D-1203.

SECTION 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed said placard from any building to which it is affixed. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of this ordinance to be recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds of Wilson County and it shall be indexed in the name of the property owner in the Grantor Index.

SECTION 5. The costs of the demolition and the underlying proceedings shall be a lien against the real property upon which the costs are incurred and any other real property of the owner located within the city limits or within one mile thereof except for the owner's primary residence.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.



The N.C. General Statutes provide for amendments to the annual budget ordinance to adjust the budget as needed during the year due to unforeseen circumstances at the time of the original budget adoption. The City needs to amend the 2023-2024 budget ordinance, grant project ordinance, and capital project ordinances to meet statutory requirements.

The proposed budget amendments are presented to comply with statutes for the 2023-2024 fiscal year.

Fiscal or Other Impact:

The annual budget is being amended by a total of \$2,471,080. The increase in the General Fund totals \$42,900. This amount consists of additional appropriations in Police of \$24,700 for asset forfeiture funded equipment purchases. Additional appropriations are in Fire for expendable equipment purchases of \$5,000 funded with contributions. Additional appropriations in Parks and Recreation of \$13,200 for a new gator utility vehicle funded with tournament proceeds. Reduction in Public Works of (\$235,800) in the contract street resurfacing account to fund a transfer to 2024 Public Street Maintenance and Construction Capital Project Fund. The

remaining General fund appropriations include aforementioned \$235,800 for a transfer to 2024 Public Street Maintenance and Construction Capital Project Fund.

The Electric Fund increase is \$2,263,000. This amount includes a generator purchase funded with debt proceeds.

The Industrial Air Center Fund increase is \$165,180 for runway light installation.

The Community Development Fund is reducing their project repairs account by (\$16,600) to fund a transfer of \$16,600 to close out the 2022 Urgent Repair Program Grant Project Fund.

The Grant project budget had increases of \$18,240 to amend a project.

The Capital projects budget had an increase of \$1,547,830 to amend three projects.

APPLICANT ASSURANCES

The applicant hereby assures and certifies that it will comply with the FEMA regulations, policies, guidelines and requirements including OMB's Circulars No. A-95 and A-102, and FMC 74-4, as they relate to the application, acceptance and use of Federal funds for this Federally assisted project. Also, the Applicant gives assurance and certifies with respect to and as a condition for the grant that:

- 1. It possesses legal authority to apply for the grant, and to finance and construct the proposed facilities; that a resolution, motion or similar action has been duly adopted or passed as an official act of the applicant's governing body, authorizing the filing of the application, including all understandings and assurances contained therein, and directing and authorizing the person identified as the official representative of the applicant to act in connection with the application and to provide such additional information as may be required.
- 2. It will comply with the provisions of: Executive Order 11988, relating to Floodplain Management and Executive Order 11990, relating to Protection of Wetlands.
- It will have sufficient funds available to meet the non-Federal share of the cost for construction projects. Sufficient funds will be available when construction is completed to assure effective operation and maintenance of the facility for the purpose constructed.
- 4. It will not enter into a construction contract(s) for the project or undertake other activities until the conditions of the grant program(s) have been met.
- 5. It will provide and maintain competent and adequate architectural engineering supervision and inspection at the construction site to insure that the completed work conforms with the approved plans and specifications; that it will furnish progress reports and such other information as the Federal grantor agency may need.
- 6. It will operate and maintain the facility in accordance with the minimum standards as may be required or prescribed by the applicable Federal, State and local agencies for the maintenance and operation of such facilities.
- 7. It will give the grantor agency and the Comptroller General, through any authorized representative, access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, or documents related to the grant.
- 8. It will require the facility to be designed to comply with the "American Standard Specifications for Making Buildings and Facilities Accessible to, and Usable by the Physically Handicapped," Number A117.1-1961, as modified (41 CFR 101-17-7031). The applicant will be responsible for conducting inspections to insure compliance with these specifications by the contractor.
- 9. It will cause work on the project to be commenced within a reasonable time after receipt of notification from the approving Federal agency that funds have been approved and will see that work on the project will be prosecuted to completion with reasonable diligence.
- 10. It will not dispose of or encumber its title or other interests in the site and facilities during the period of Federal interest or while the Government holds bonds, whichever is the longer.
- 11. It agrees to comply with Section 311, P.L. 93-288 and with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 83-352) and in accordance with Title VI of the Act, no person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity for which the applicant receives Federal financial assistance and will immediately take any measures necessary to effectuate this agreement.
