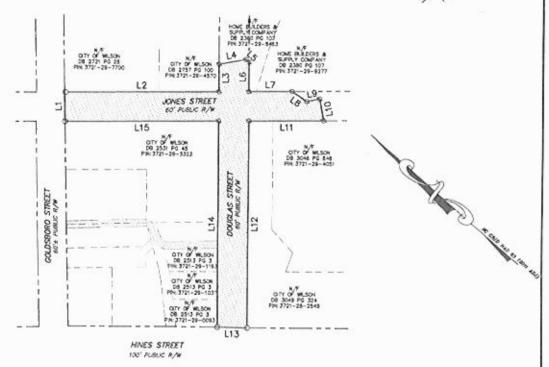

#### Issue:

The City of Wilson adopted its current comprehensive plan "Wilson Growing Together: The 2030 Comprehensive Plan" in 2010. The Plan included 51 goals, more than 300 policies, actions, and implementation actions. The 2043 Update has revised sections of the 2030 Plan to reflect the changes that have occurred in the community since 2010 and to support a renewed vision for the future of the community. In some cases, issue areas have been added that are not part of the original 2030 Plan.

The 2043 Comprehensive Plan is utilizing a new online format known as a Story Map. This will allow both staff and members of the public to interact and understand the plan in a more dynamic way than ever before. There are interactive maps and graphics as well as connections to supplemental documents and resources. The 2043 Update will allow staff to keep up to date information available including reporting on implementation, performance metrics, and future opportunities for public engagement.

#### Background / Summary:

The Comprehensive Plan is a roadmap that provides guidance on where and how a community will grow and change over a period of time. The City of Wilson uses this as a policy document to set priorities and make important land use and investment decisions. The 2043 Update addresses land use, development, transportation, public investment, and identifies other community priorities. The Project Team was led by City of Wilson staff and supported by local consultants at Clarion Associates and VHB. As part of this process, the City of Wilson gathered community input from August 2022 through October 2023 to help guide the development of a renewed vision for Wilson.

#### RESOLUTION APPROVING A PROPOSAL FROM BANC OF AMERICA PUBLIC CAPITAL CORP TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION OF FIRE VEHICLE AND EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Wilson, North Carolina (the "City") has previously determined to undertake the purchase of certain vehicles and equipment (the "Equipment"), and, in connection therewith, issued a request for proposals to various financial institutions; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 160A-20 of the North Carolina General Statutes, as amended, the City is authorized to finance the acquisition of the Equipment by an installment contract that creates a security interest in the property financed to secure repayment of the financing; and

WHEREAS, the City received several proposals, and the City Manager and Chief Financial Officer now recommend that the City Council approve the proposal from Banc of America Public Capital Corp (BAPCC) for the financing of the Equipment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Wilson, North Carolina, as follows:

- 1. The City hereby determines to finance the Equipment through BAPCC in accordance with the proposal dated March 26, 2024. The amount financed shall not exceed \$4,896,850 including \$935,405 with a term of 36 months and \$3,961,445 with a term of 59 months from closing, and shall bear interest at an annual rate (in the absence of default or change in tax status) not to exceed 4.3075% for 36 months and 4.0673% for 59 months.
- 2. The City hereby authorizes the City Manager and the Chief Financial Officer (the "Authorized Officers"), or any one of them, to execute and deliver an installment financing agreement consistent with the BAPCC Proposal (the "Financing Agreement"), and execute such certificates and documents and to take all such further action as they may consider necessary or desirable, to carry out the financing of the Equipment as contemplated by the BAPCC Proposal and this resolution.
- 3. The City covenants that, to the extent permitted by the Constitution and laws of the State of North Carolina, it will comply with the requirements of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") as required so that the interest on the City's obligations under the Financing Agreement will not be included in the gross income for federal income tax purposes of the registered owners of the interest payment obligations.
- 4. No deficiency judgment may be rendered against the City in any action for breach of a contractual obligation under the Financing Agreement, and the taxing power of the City is not and may not be pledged directly or indirectly to secure any moneys due under the Financing Agreement, the security interest in the Equipment provided under the Financing Agreement being the sole security for the City's obligations thereunder.

- 5. The City intends that the adoption of this resolution will be a declaration of the City's official intent to reimburse expenditures for the Equipment that is to be financed from the proceeds of the financing described above. The City intends that funds that have been advanced, or that may be advanced, from the City's general fund, or any other City fund related to the Equipment, for Equipment costs may be reimbursed from the financing proceeds.
- 6. All prior actions of City officers in furtherance of the purposes of this resolution are hereby ratified, approved, and confirmed. All other resolutions (or parts thereof) in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict.
  - 7. This resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.
